## A SHORT STEP FROM MOVING TO RELO.....

ne-Group has seen the future and it's relocation.

The European network says it is responding to the demands of clients and trade colleagues by putting more emphasis on a broad spectrum of relocation services.

Its members are all lining up to adopt Eura's DSP certification to support its positioning of itself as a full-service international relocation group. Having this certification will give its members an even stronger advantage in bidding for corporate business, it says.

On top of that the group is fastening its eyes on Eastern Europe, particularly Russia,

Hungary, Czechoslovakia and the Ukraine. It has sent out teams to investigate the moving/relocation resources in those countries to see if it can recruit.

But it is still demanding that access can only be via the FIDI-FAIM process: "We'd rather have no member than the best of the worse," commented Karolien Geers of Ziegler Relocations.

One-Group is moving into these eastern markets again at the prompting of its growing number of trading partners who are looking for reliable support in what are often considered difficult areas.

The group has a very clear sighted strategy for the future of the industry and will be well placed to take advantage of the upturn when it comes — or if it comes?

Sarah Robinson, of Coca Cola Hellenic, a guest speaker at the recent One-Group annual meeting, has her doubts. She told the 42 members gathered in Greece that reluctantly she was forced to conclude that the trend will be towards smaller shipments and less emphasis on moving entire families.

Given a choice between relocating a single individual or someone with a family, the single person is most likely to win, she said.

ut even this is unlikely to deter One-Group members who presented Rolf Schaefers of Donath International with a special award for his wholehearted commitment to the organisation tackling a lot of projects and really immersing himself in seeking additional benefits.
